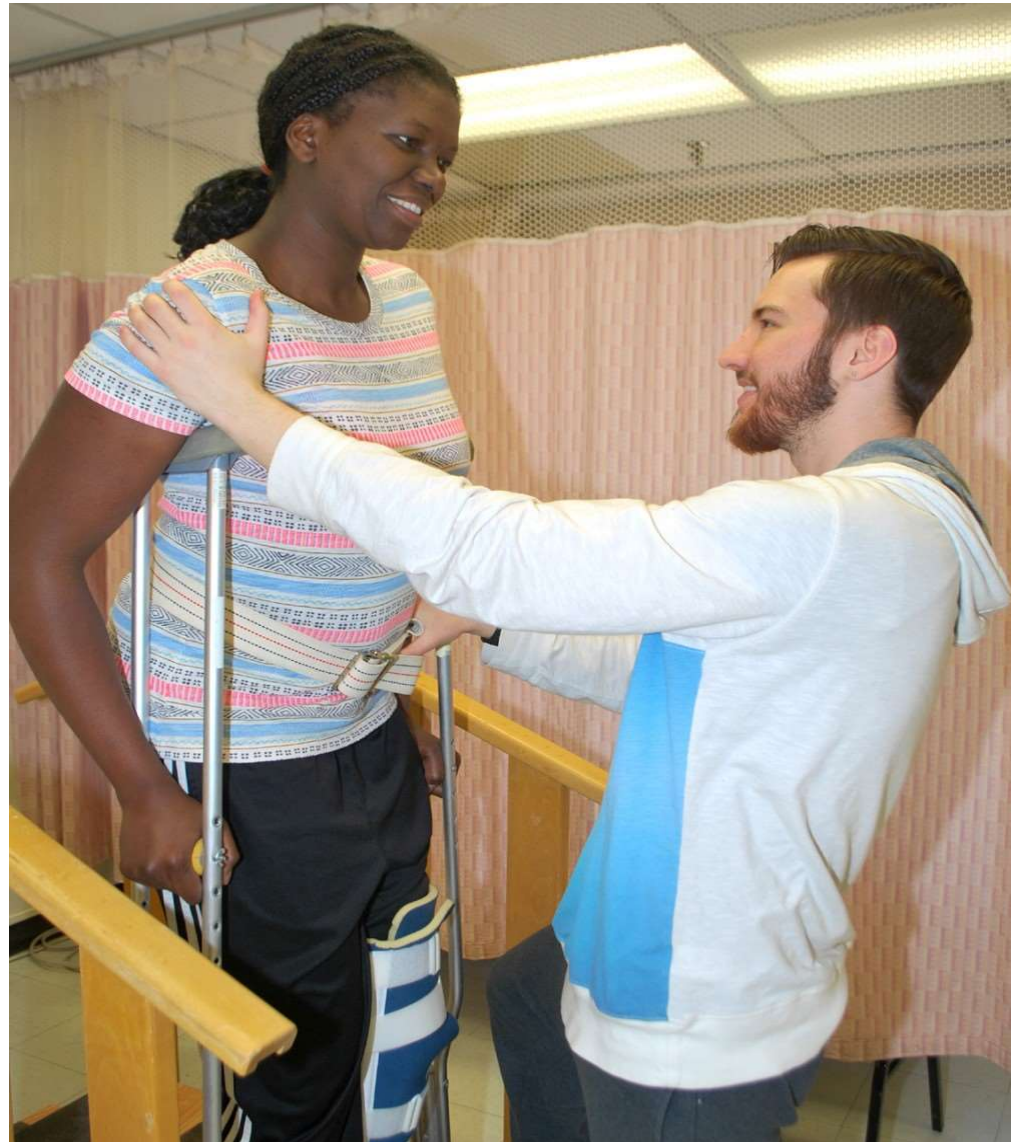

What is a PTA?

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A Physical Therapist Assistant is...



- A licensed health care provider who works under the direction and supervision of a Physical Therapist (PT).
- PTAs help people of all ages who have medical problems, or other health-related conditions that limit their ability to move and perform functional activities in their daily lives.
- Care provided by a PTA may include teaching patients/clients exercise for mobility, strength and coordination, training for activities such as walking with crutches, canes, or walkers, manual therapy, and the use of physical agents and electrotherapy such as ultrasound and electrical stimulation.
- The education of a PTA requires that the candidate earn an Associate Degree meeting criteria set by the Commission on Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE).

PTA Application

It is your responsibility to carefully read the PTA Application



- All admission requirements must be completed by **8/1/2024**, including submission of proof of documentation of meeting the requirements.
 - Including but not limited to any CLEP test, course substitutions, and credit by exam.
 - Courses may NOT be in progress.
- Official final transcripts from **all** previously attended colleges/universities, regardless of age of transcripts and applicability to the PTA Program must be submitted by the deadline. This includes college credits earned while in high school.

PTA Admission Requirements for the January 2025 cohort



- **Statistics:**

- MAT 1200 (3 credits)
- Minimum C
- Within 5 years prior to application

- **General Biology I**

- Bio 1210 (4 credits)
- Minimum C+
- Within 5 years prior to application

PTA Admission Requirements for January 2025 cohort



- English Composition, ENG 1010
 - Minimum C
- Introduction to Psychology, PSY 1011
 - Minimum C
- College and Career Success, CCS 1001
 - Minimum C
 - May be waived if transferring in 24+ credits

PTA Admission Requirements for January 2024 cohort

● ATI TEAS

- Nursing OR Allied Health version
- ATI TEAS with score equivalent to 60% or higher required.
- Official test scores must be submitted by the application deadline, if not taken at a CT Community College. Test scores will be valid for three (3) years and must be taken between **8/1/21 to 8/1/24**.
- Students with higher scores on these tests are stronger candidates.
- Students can take test multiple times – highest score utilized.

PTA Admission Requirements for January 2025 cohort

- **PTA GPA: 2.5 Minimum**
 - Calculation specific to PTA applicants
 - May differ from your college GPA
 - Calculated according to courses required for admission
 - BIO 1210, MAT 1200, PSY 1011, ENG 1010

PTA Admission Requirements for January 2025 cohort



- Documented observation hours:
 - Minimum 10 hours in an in-patient physical therapy setting
 - Minimum 10 hours in an out-patient physical therapy setting
 - Totaling **minimum 20 hours**
 - More hours does not give you an advantage!

 - If you cannot get the hours contact the PTA Program Director
 - Must be handed in by the application deadline or you will not be eligible for admission

Ranking Formula for Admission*



PTA GPA	40%
BIO 1210	20%
MAT 1200	20%
ATI TEAS	20%

Applicants will be ranked according to final score with up to the top 30 accepted into the program.

Admissions Decisions



- Competitive selective admissions program
- Up to 30 applicants admitted each year
- Any student denied admission this admission cycle, will need to REAPPLY in the following application cycle.



What do I need to know if I'm accepted?

Accepted Students



- Must declare intent to attend by deadline
- Understand the requirement: Before clinical experiences you will:
 - Complete a criminal background check Complete a substance screening
- Students who do not pass the **background check** may be excluded from clinical sites and may not be able to meet the competencies required for the program.
- Students who do not pass the **drug test** may be excluded from clinical sites and may not be able to meet the competencies required for the program.

Program Requirements



- A grade of "C" or higher must be attained in all physical therapy courses and all courses required for the degree.
- Students must maintain a 2.3 or higher PTA GPA while in the program.
- A grade of "P" (pass) must be attained in all clinical education components to meet the degree.

Program Requirements



- Complete & submit all health and training requirements according to deadlines given.
- Become student member of the American Physical Therapy Association. (\$90/year)
- Obtain certification in First Aid & Healthcare Provider CPR.
 - American Heart Association or American Red Cross

Additional Requirements / costs



- Tuition & Fees
- Books
- Criminal background check & drug test (annual)
- Professional attire for clinical education experiences
- Licensure review courses
- Transportation
- Physical / PPD test (annual)
 - Immunizations
 - Hep B, MMR, Varicella, Tdap, Covid-19 w/booster
 - Flu vaccine (annual)
- Purchase of PTA 'kit' 1st and 2nd semester

What is the total cost of the program?



As of the 2023 graduating class, the total cost was ~\$19,385.

Clinical Education



- Clinical learning is held at a variety of healthcare sites throughout Connecticut (CT) and these clinical sites are assigned at the discretion of the PTA faculty.
- Students may be required to travel over seventy- five (75) minutes to their experiences.
- Students are required to provide their own transportation, living expenses (as necessary), and any other expenses while on clinical education experiences.

Considerations for Success



- Sufficient reading time, study time and practice.
 - Attendance at Open Lab.
 - Additional 2-3 days on campus outside of class time.
 - ~2-3 hours of preparation, studying, practicing per hour of on campus time
- Curriculum becomes more challenging each semester.
- Work hours to minimum – students who work more than 20 hours per week, in general, struggle and have difficulty continuing to be successful in the program.

Considerations for Success



- You are entering a healthcare career **program of study**- not just taking additional classes. Knowledge is cumulative.
- You will be preparing to take a national licensure exam.
- You will have the responsibility for caring for patients.
- In addition to learning knowledge and skills, you will be expected to demonstrate professional behaviors in all classes & clinical experiences.
