- All admission requirements must be completed by June 1, 2019 and official documentation proving that the requirements have been met must be submitted by this date. (This Includes, but is not limited to, Advanced Placement (AP), College Level Examination Program (CLEP), and credit-by-exam scores and course substitution forms.)
- The Mathematics and Anatomy & Physiology I admission requirements must be completed spring 2015 semester or later with grades of "C+" or better. The English Composition and General Psychology admission requirements must be completed with grades of "C" or better.
- All supporting official documents and transcripts must be submitted by June 1, 2019. Official, final transcripts from all colleges/universities ever attended, regardless of age of transcripts and applicability to the PTA program must be submitted. This includes college credits earned while in high school.
- Applicants must achieve an Adjusted Individual Total Score of 60% or higher on Test of Essential Academic Skills taken by June 1, 2019. Test scores are valid from June 1, 2016 to June 1, 2019. Official test scores must be submitted by June 1, 2019 if not taken at a CT Community College. Applicants may take the test multiple times.
- Documentation for volunteer/observational experience totaling a minimum of 10 hours in each of an out-patient and an in-patient physical therapy setting (minimum 20 hours total) must be completed and submitted to the Admissions Office by June 1, 2019.
- Attendance at a PTA Information Session is strongly recommended, but is not required.
- If admitted to the program, PTA courses must be completed in the semester indicated in the program. General Education courses must be completed in the semester indicated in the program or earlier with minimum grades of "C". Anatomy & Physiology II must be completed spring 2015 semester or later, or during the first semester of the program with minimum grade of "C+".
- Applicants who are not admitted to the PTA Program for spring 2020 and who wish to seek admission in succeeding years must reapply. Note that the application process, admission requirements, and curriculum may change without notice.

Background Check/Drug Screening Requirement: All accepted students will be required to undergo a background check, including fingerprinting, for felony convictions and a drug screening. A positive drug screen will prevent a student from enrolling in the program. Those with a positive background check may be excluded from clinical sites and may not be able to meet the competencies required for the program. Clinical learning is held at a variety of healthcare sites throughout Connecticut (CT) and these clinical sites are assigned at the discretion of the PTA faculty.

Clinical Education Experiences: The NVCC PTA Program offers clinical education experiences throughout CT. Students may be required to travel over seventy-five (75) minutes to their experiences. Students are required to provide their own transportation, living expenses (as necessary), and any other expenses while on clinical education experiences.
