PLACEMENT TESTING:

The last available date for placement testing is Thursday, September 8th between 4pm and 6pm at our *Waterbury Campus*. The testing center is located in Kinney Hall, room K519. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.

ADVISING AND REGISTRATION:

Visit the Waterbury or Danbury campus anytime during normal business hours of Monday – Friday, 8am – 5pm for advising and registration assistance.

TUITION AND FEES:

Late Start courses are extension fund and cost \$168 per credit plus fees. Full payment of tuition and fees is required at the point of registration for students who do not have an official financial aid award. **Students who have received a financial aid award must register for classes by Monday, September 12th**. There are no payment plans available for the late start semester. Methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, Discover or the College payment plan. **Financial Aid is not available to Non-Degree Students**.
