The standard semester began on Thursday, January 21st. At this point, the next available session would be our *Spring 2016 Late Start* which begins on Thursday, February 4th and ends May 17th. If you have not already done so, please schedule your appointment(s):

- 1. <u>PLACEMENT TESTING:</u> Students need to take, or be officially waived from, the Accuplacer® (placement test). If you do not meet the criteria to be eligible for a waiver of the placement test, you will need to take the test in English and/or Math. To schedule a placement test, visit www.timecenter.com/nvcctest. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.
- 2. <u>ADVISING & REGISTRATION:</u> All new degree-seeking students are <u>required</u> to meet with an advisor before registering. Non-degree and transfer students are encouraged to also meet with an advisor, but it is not required. Stop in to the admissions office, Kinney Hall room K500 or at our Danbury Campus Monday Friday, between the hours of 8am 4:30pm to meet with an advisor.

Full payment of tuition and fees is required at the point of registration for students who do not have an official financial aid award. **Students who have received a financial aid award must register for classes by <u>FEBRUARY 4th</u>. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard and Discover. There is no payment plan available for these classes. Please refer to our <u>Late Start information guide</u> for additional information on tuition and a complete list of Late Start courses.**
