

Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Fall 2016 semester. The standard semester began on Monday, August 29th. At this point, the next available session would be our *Fall 2016 Late Start* which begins on Monday, September 12<sup>th</sup> and ends December 14<sup>th</sup>. If you have not already done so, you will need to submit the following documents to be accepted and allowed to register for classes. Be sure to include your name and student/ NetID#, which can be found in the subject line of your email. Once we receive all required documents you will receive an acceptance letter. If you have expressed interest in our <a href="Nursing">Nursing</a>, <a href="Respiratory">Respiratory</a>, <a href="Radiology">Radiology</a> or <a href="Physical Therapist Assistant">Physical Therapist Assistant</a> majors, please click the appropriate link for important fact sheets on these programs. If you prefer to move your application to our Spring 2017 semester, please call (203) 575-8032.

<u>Proof of High School Completion</u> : High school diploma, GED, or high school transcript that includes the date of graduation is required for both acceptance into a degree or certificate program and to be eligible for financial aid.
Immunization Requirements: All degree or certificate seeking students born after 12/31/56 are required, by state law, to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR). Those born as of 1/1/1980 also need to submit documentation for 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Click here for the immunization form.
<u>College transcripts (if applicable):</u> Submit <b>official transcripts</b> to qualify for transfer credits. <b>Unofficial transcripts</b> may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and to meet prerequisite requirements.
SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement. Minimum SAT score of 500 in Math and/or minimum score of 450 in Critical Reading or Writing is needed. Minimum ACT score of 18 in Math and/or minimum score of 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading (combined) is needed. Math courses above College Algebra may require taking the placement test.

## **PLACEMENT TESTING:**

If you are not eligible to be waived from placement testing (see above), you will need to take our placement test in Math and/or English. The **ONLY** remaining late start placement test session is on **Thursday, September 8<sup>th</sup> between 4pm and 6pm** at our Waterbury Campus, Kinney Hall, Room K519. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.

## **ADVISING AND REGISTRATION:**

Visit the Admissions office at the Waterbury or Danbury campus anytime Monday – Friday, 8am – 4:30pm for advising and registration assistance. Students MUST BE ACCEPTED (see above).

## **TUITION AND FEES:**

Late Start courses are extension fund and cost \$168 per credit plus fees. Full payment of tuition and fees is required at the point of registration for students who do not have an official financial aid award. **Students who have received a financial aid award must register for classes by Monday, September 12**<sup>th</sup>. There are no payment plans available for the late start semester. Methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, Discover or the College payment plan. **Financial Aid is not available to Non-Degree Students.** Please refer to our <u>Late Start information guide</u> for additional information on tuition and a complete list of Late Start courses
