

IMPORTANT: This information is intended ONLY for NON-DEGREE students which includes those students not pursuing a degree program at NVCC, not enrolling full-time and/or not applying for financial aid. Student who are considered non-degree include:

- High school students taking an NVCC class prior to graduation
- Home schooled students who have not completed their high school requirements
- Students who have chosen not to enroll in a degree program
- Students taking courses to meet requirements of their home college.

Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Fall 2016 semester. The semester began on Monday, August 29th. At this point, the next available session would be our [Fall 2016 Late Start](#) which begins on Monday, September 12th and ends on December 17th. If applicable, you will need to submit the documents listed below as soon as possible. Be sure to include your name and student/NetID #, which can be found in the subject line of your email message. If you prefer to move your application to our Spring 2017 semester, please call (203) 575-8032.

OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS (AS APPLICABLE):

- College transcripts: Unofficial transcripts may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and/or to meet course prerequisite requirements. Once your transcript is received and reviewed, we will send you an email letting you know if you need to take the placement test(s).
- SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement. Minimum **SAT** score of 500 in Math and/or minimum score of 450 in Critical Reading or Writing is needed. Minimum **ACT** score of 18 in Math and/or minimum score of 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading (combined) is needed. Math courses above College Algebra may require taking the placement test.

PLACEMENT TESTING:

If you are not eligible to be waived from placement testing (see above), you will need to take our placement test in Math and/or English. The **ONLY** remaining late start placement test session is on **Thursday, September 8th between 4pm and 6pm** at our Waterbury Campus, Kinney Hall, Room K519. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.

ADVISING AND REGISTRATION:

- Underage and homeschooled students must contact the Admissions office at (203) 575-8032 to schedule an appointment for advising and registration. High school partnership students will be notified of their assigned advising day.
- Advising is optional for all other non-degree students. To register, you will need to login to the myCommNet student information systems. Your student ID/NetID# is located in the subject line of the email message. Click here for [instructions on first time login and email access](#).

TUITION AND FEES:

Late Start courses are extension fund and cost \$168 per credit plus fees. Full payment of tuition and fees is required at the point of registration for students who do not have an official financial aid award. **Students who have received a financial aid award must register for classes by Monday, September 12th**. There are no payment plans available for the late start semester. Methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, Discover or the College payment plan. **Financial Aid is not available to Non-Degree Students.** Please refer to our [Late Start information guide](#) for additional information on tuition and a complete list of Late Start courses
