Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Spring 2017 semester. The semester begins on Thursday, January 19, 2017. If you have not already done so, you should APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID NOW! Click here for a brief Informational Video on the financial aid process. A payment is expected at the time of registration.

RECOMMENDED LANGUAGE: Students must be officially accepted to the college in order to receive financial aid and to register for classes. In addition, students must provide proof of immunizations as a registration requirement. Details on these requirements are listed below under "documents". Be sure to include your name and student/NetID # on all documents, which can be found in the subject line of the email. If you have expressed interest in our Nursing, Respiratory, Radiology or Physical Therapist Assistant majors, please click the appropriate link for important information specific to those majors. Visit Nv.edu/apply and click STEP 1A for important applications and deadlines specific to these majors.

DOCUMENTS:

- 1. <u>Proof of High School Completion</u>: High school diploma, GED, or high school transcript that includes the date of graduation is required for both acceptance into a degree or certificate program and to be eligible for financial aid.
- 2. <u>Immunization Requirements:</u> All degree or certificate seeking students born after 12/31/56 are required, by state law, to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of <u>Measles</u>, <u>Mumps</u>, and <u>Rubella</u> (MMR). Those born as of 1/1/1980 also need to submit documentation for 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Click here for the <u>immunization form</u> or provide us with a copy of your immunization records.
- 3. <u>College and AP transcripts (if applicable):</u> Submit **official transcripts** to qualify for transfer credits. **Unofficial transcripts** may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and to meet prerequisite requirements.
- 4. SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement.

If you do not meet the criteria above to be eligible for a waiver of the placement test based on SAT/ACT scores or prior College course work, please schedule your placement test as indicated below. We strongly recommend that you prepare in advance for taking the Accuplacer® test, as the test results may exempt you from having to take additional courses.
