If applicable, you will need to submit the documents listed below as soon as possible. Be sure to include your name and student/NetID #, which can be found in the subject line of your email message.

OPTIONAL DOCUMENTS (AS APPLICABLE):

- College transcripts: Unofficial transcripts may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and/or to meet course prerequisite requirements. Once your transcript is received and reviewed, we will send you an email letting you know if you need to take the placement test(s).
- SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement.

PLACEMENT TESTING: (Click here for a brief Informational Video on placement testing)

If you do not meet the criteria above to be eligible for a waiver of the placement test, please schedule your placement test as indicated below. We strongly recommend that you prepare in advance for taking the Accuplacer® test, as the test results may exempt you from having to take additional courses. The sooner you test, the sooner you can register for classes. Come in early! Classes fill quickly and sections become limited! Visit our <u>testing center site</u> for preparation information.

TUITION AND FEES:

A payment is expected at the time of registration. Registering early allows you to secure your classes with only a minimum payment of the fees. Beginning the first week in January, full payment of both tuition and fees will be required at the time of registration.
