Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Spring 2018 semester. The standard semester began on Wednesday, January 17th. At this point, the next available session would be our <u>Spring 2018 Late Start</u> which **begins on Wednesday, January 31**st. If you have not already done so, you will need to submit the following documents to be accepted and allowed to register for classes. Be sure to include your name and student/NetID#, which can be found in the subject line of your email.

In order to register and be approved for financial aid you must first be accepted to the college. To be accepted you must submit the documents listed below. If you have not already done so, please submit them as soon as possible. Be sure to include your name and student/NetID # on all documents, which can be found in the subject line of the email. If you have expressed interest in our Nursing, Respiratory, Radiology or Physical Therapist Assistant majors, please click the appropriate link for important information specific to those majors. Visit nv.edu/apply and click STEP 1A for important applications and deadlines specific to these majors.

- 1. <u>Proof of High School Completion</u>: High school diploma, GED, or high school transcript that includes the date of graduation is required for both acceptance into a degree or certificate program and to be eligible for financial aid.
- 2. <u>Immunization Requirements:</u> All degree or certificate seeking students born after 12/31/56 are required, by state law, to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR). Those born as of 1/1/1980 also need to submit documentation for 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Click here for the <u>immunization form</u>or provide us with a copy of your immunization records.
- 3. <u>College and AP transcripts (if applicable):</u> Submit **official transcripts** to qualify for transfer credits. **Unofficial transcripts** may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and to meet prerequisite requirements.
- 4. SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement.

SAT - Prior to March 2016: 500 in Math and/or 450 in Critical Reading or Writing

SAT - **March 2016 and later:** 530 in Math and/or 26 in Writing Language, 25 in Reading or 510 in Evidence Based Reading/Writing

ACT: 18 in Math and/or 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading combined.

PLACEMENT TESTING:

If you are not eligible to be waived from placement testing (see above), you will need to take our placement test in Math and/or English. The **ONLY** remaining late start placement test session is on **Monday, January 29th between 2:00pm and 5:00pm** at our Waterbury Campus, Kinney Hall, Room K519. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.

ADVISING AND REGISTRATION:

Visit the Admissions office at the Waterbury or Danbury campus anytime Monday – Friday, 8am – 4:30pm for advising and registration assistance. Students MUST BE ACCEPTED (see above).
