

Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Spring 2020 semester. The semester begins on Wednesday, January 22, 2020. If you have not already done so, you should **[APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID NOW!](#)**

YOUR NEXT STEPS: In order to register and be approved for financial aid you must first be accepted to the college. To be accepted, you must submit the documents listed below. If you have not already done so, please submit them as soon as possible. Be sure to include your name and student/NetID # on all documents, which can be found in the subject line of the email. Registration for new students begins Tuesday, November 5th. If you have expressed interest in our [Nursing](#), [Respiratory Care](#), [Radiologic Technology](#) or [Physical Therapist Assistant](#) majors, please follow the link for important information specific to those majors.

1. **Proof of High School Completion:** Copy of high school diploma, GED, or a high school transcript that includes the date of graduation is required for both acceptance into a degree or certificate program and to be eligible for financial aid.
2. **Immunization Requirements:** All degree or certificate seeking students born after 12/31/56 are required, by state law, to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR). Those born as of 1/1/1980 also need to submit documentation for 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Click here for the [immunization form](#) or provide us with a copy of your immunization records.
3. **College and AP transcripts (if applicable):** Submit **official transcripts** to qualify for transfer credits. **Unofficial transcripts** may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer® Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and to meet prerequisite requirements.
4. **SAT, ACT or GED test scores (optional):** Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement. Minimum score(s) requirements to be waived from testing are:
SAT (as of March 2016): 530 in Math and/or 26 in Writing Language, 25 in Reading or 510 in Evidence Based Reading/Writing
SAT (prior to March 2016): 500 in Math and/or 450 in Critical Reading or Writing
ACT: 18 in Math and/or 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading combined.
GED: 165 in Math Reasoning and/or 165 in Reasoning Language Arts

HOW TO SUBMIT YOUR DOCUMENTATION (excludes official College and AP transcripts):

- Bring your completed forms or documentation to the Admissions office at the Waterbury Campus in Kinney Hall, K500 or to the Danbury Campus administrative offices.

PLACEMENT TESTING:

If you do not meet the criteria above to be eligible for a waiver of the placement test based on SAT/ACT scores or prior College course work, please schedule your placement test for either the Waterbury or the Danbury Campus at <http://www.nv.edu/accuplacer>. **IMPORTANT:** You must bring a valid photo ID and your banner/student ID number to your testing appointment. We strongly recommend that you prepare in advance for taking the Accuplacer® test, as the test results may exempt you from having to take additional courses. REGISTRATION:

After all required documents are submitted, you will receive an acceptance letter and details on how to sign up for a registration session. The sooner you test and are accepted, the sooner you can register for classes. Come in early! Classes fill quickly and sections become limited!

TUITION AND FEES:

If you have not already done so, you should **[APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID NOW!](#)** A minimum payment of both the College Services and Student Activity fees is expected at the time of registration to hold your seats. Beginning January 2, 2020, full payment of both tuition and fees will be required at the time of registration. An official financial aid award can be applied as payment. **Financial Aid is not available to Non-Degree Students.** Other acceptable methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, or the College payment plan.
