

Thank you for applying to Naugatuck Valley Community College for the Spring 2016 semester. The standard semester began on Thursday, January 21<sup>st</sup>. At this point, the next available session would be our *Spring 2016 Late Start* which begins on February, 4<sup>th</sup> and ends May 17<sup>th</sup>. If you have not already done so, you will need to submit the following documents to be accepted and allowed to register for classes. Be sure to include your name and student/ NetID#, which can be found in the subject line of your email. Once we receive all required documents you will receive an acceptance letter. If you have expressed interest in our <u>Nursing</u>, <u>Respiratory</u>, <u>Radiology</u> or <u>Physical Therapist Assistant</u> majors, please click the appropriate link for important fact sheets on these programs.

- Proof of High School Completion: High school diploma, GED, or high school transcript that includes the date of graduation is required for both acceptance into a degree or certificate program and to be eligible for financial aid.
- Immunization Requirements: All degree or certificate seeking students born after 12/31/56 are required, by state law, to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR). Those born as of 1/1/1980 also need to submit documentation for 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Click here for the immunization form.
- College transcripts (if applicable): Submit official transcripts to qualify for transfer credits. Unofficial transcripts may be submitted to be waived from the Accuplacer<sup>®</sup> Assessment Test (placement test) based on previous math and/or English courses and to meet prerequisite requirements.
- SAT or ACT test scores (optional): Submit scores to be waived from testing and determine math and/or English placement. Minimum SAT score of 500 in Math and/or minimum score of 450 in Critical Reading or Writing is needed. Minimum ACT score of 18 in Math and/or minimum score of 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading (combined) is needed. Math courses above College Algebra may require taking the placement test.

If you are not eligible to be waived from placement testing (see above), you will need to take our placement test in Math and/or English. To schedule a placement test, visit <u>www.timecenter.com/nvcctest</u>. Testing for the late start semester is not available at our Danbury campus.

After all required documents are submitted, you will receive an acceptance letter inviting you to come to admissions and register for Late Start Classes. All new degree-seeking students are <u>required</u> to meet with an advisor before registering. Non-degree and transfer students are encouraged to also meet with an advisor, but it is not required. Stop in to the admissions office, Kinney Hall room K500 or at our Danbury Campus Monday – Friday, between the hours of 8am – 4:30pm to meet with an advisor.

Full payment of tuition and fees is required at the time of registration for students who do not have an official financial aid award. **Students who have received a financial aid award must register for classes <u>FEBRUARY 4<sup>th</sup></u>. Acceptable methods of payment include cash, check, VISA, MasterCard and Discover. There is no payment plan available for these classes. Please refer to our <u>Late Start information guide</u> for additional information on tuition and a list of Late Start courses.**
