Thank you for your interest in NVCC. The following is important information you will need to register for classes.

- STUDENT ID AND COLLEGE ASSIGNED EMAIL: Your Student ID number (NetID) has been provided in the email
 portion of this communication. You will need this ID number to register online and set up your account. For
 details on configuring your initial password and your new email account, go to
 myCommNet Log- in Instructions.
- DEGREE STATUS & FINANCIAL AID: All summer students are admitted as non-degree students. If you are
 eligible for, and plan on utilizing financial aid, you <u>MUST</u> contact the admissions office prior to registering and
 select a specific degree or certificate program. See the Admissions page on our website to view a <u>checklist for</u>
 degree seeking students. After your additional documentation is received, you will be accepted into a program
 and contacted with further information.
- **FUTURE SEMESTERS:** This communication confirms <u>only</u> your summer acceptance. Additional information will be sent to you if you indicated on your application that you are also interested in enrolling as a degree-seeking student for the Fall 2017 semester. If you did not indicate an interest in the Fall 2017 semester, but are planning to attend this Fall, <u>you must notify the admissions office by calling (203) 575-8032</u>.
- REGISTRATION: Accepted, non-degree, summer students may begin registering for course(s) online beginning
 April 18th. Visit our website for instructions on how to register online. Note: Degree-seeking students will need
 to see an advisor prior to registering.
- PAYMENT: Payment is due at the time of registration. We accept VISA, MasterCard, American Express and
 Discover. You may also pay in person at the cashier's office using cash, check or credit card. For your
 convenience, a payment plan is also available. Visit the <u>paying for college</u> section of our website for additional
 information.
- PLACEMENT TESTING: If you plan to take a Math or English course, or a course that has Math or English as a prerequisite, you will need to schedule a time to take our Placement Test. You may be waived from taking the Accuplacer test by submitting your college transcript(s) indicating you have completed the necessary Math and/or English with a grade of "C" or better. You may also submit SAT or ACT scores showing the following minimum requirements to be waived from testing.
 - SAT Prior to March 2016: 500 in Math and/or 450 in Critical Reading or Writing
 - SAT March 2016 and later: 530 in Math and/or 26 in Writing Language, 25 in Reading or 510 in Evidence Based Reading/Writing
 - ACT: 18 in Math and/or 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading combined.

If you do not meet the criteria above to be eligible for a waiver of the placement test, please visit http://www.timecenter.com/nvcctest to schedule your Waterbury testing appointment. To schedule a testing appointment at our Danbury location, call (203) 437-9699.

- **PRIOR COLLEGE TRANSCRIPTS:** If you plan to take a course that has a prerequisite, please provide a transcript indicating the prerequisite course(s) you have completed and include the name(s) and course number(s) of the course you are planning to take at NVCC. You may also fax this information to us at (203) 596-8766 or include in a reply to this email address. We will contact you and let you know when you are eligible to register.
